Apalachia Lake

Apalachia Lake is a small, deep, cool-water reservoir nestled in the western North Carolina mountains. The reservoir in its entirety is located solely within Cherokee County. The dam was designed and built to generate hydroelectric energy during World War II. Adjacent to the Nantahala National Forest, the reservoir has very little private shoreline development and NO commercial recreation facilities. Apalachia is one of the most pristine lakes of unparalleled beauty offering fishing, canoeing, hiking and primitive camping recreation areas. Because of the remote location, relatively few anglers use the reservoir. Sport fish include smallmouth bass, spotted bass, largemouth bass, redbreast sunfish and white bass.

 Construction of the Apalachia Dam began in 1941 and took 2 years to complete. The dam is 150 feet high and stretches 1,308 feet across the Hiwassee River. · Apalachia is a relatively small reservoir with 31 miles of shoreline and

about 1,070 acres of water surface. Apalachia is a run-of-river reservoir, meaning that water is passed through the reservoir without being stored long-term. A public boat ramp is located below the Hiwassee Lake Dam at the TVA

Powerhouse. Fishing the shoreline is also accessed at this same location.

Hiwassee Lake

liwassee Lake is located on the Hiwassee River, stretching 22 miles through western North Carolina. Surrounded by the Nantahala and Cherokee National Forests, it is upstream from Lake Apalachia. With three marinas and numerous public access points, including Hanging Dog Recreation Area, Hiwassee Lake is easy to enjoy. Its location makes an exceptionally beautiful location for recreation and serves as a rich habitat for deer, wild turkey and other wild animals. The flow of water in this reservoir comes from deep below the surface and can be refreshingly cool even on the warmest summer day.



Rivers in and near Cherokee County include the Hiwassee, Valley, Nottley, Ocoee and Nantahala. The Hiwassee River is approximately 147 miles long. Its headwaters are in North Georgia but it flows through Cherokee County turning westward to Tennessee, ultimately flowing into the Tennessee River. The Valley River begins as a pair of springs from within the Snowbird Mountains and flows southwest into the Hiwassee River. The town of Murphy is situated at the confluence of the Hiwassee and Valley Rivers. The rivers are a popular source of outdoor adventure, including white water rafting, kayaking, canoeing and fishing.

· Cherokee County has few waterfalls because of our topography. Most waterflow starts small in the higher elevation and at the point the waterflow can become a waterfall the elevation is not steep enough to create a fall. North Shoal Creek, Leatherwood and Kennedy are small falls in our area but

Murphy is a town in and the county seat of Cherokee County, North Carolina, United States.

It is situated at the confluence of the Hiwassee and Valley rivers. It is the westernmost

county seat in the state of North Carolina, approximately 360 miles (580 km) from the state

capital in Raleigh. The population of Murphy was 1,627 at the 2010 census.

Historic Finds

John C. Campbell Folk School - Brasstown, NC
A treasured resource for traditional music, dance, crafts and folk lore, the campus has many historic buildings, beautiful trails and a rich art community focused on creative

Cherokee County County Courthouse - Murphy, NC The courthouse was built of locally quarried stone from the nearby community of Marble, NC. It is a uniquely regal blue marble gem located in the historic downtown

The Cherokee County Historical Museum in Murphy, North Carolina displays the rich history of Native American and pioneer settlers in the far-western corner of the state.

<u>hn Franklin Cobb House - Bellview, NC (US19/129)</u>

e John Franklin Cobb House, or Cobb Plantation, near the North Carolina-Georg ine in southern Cherokee County was built as a log cabin in 1863, making it one of the ew surviving pre-Civil War structures in Cherokee County. Since the 1880s the logs have been covered with weatherboarding. Numerous rooms have also been added to the cabin since the 1870s in a rather haphazard manner. The house remained ocal magistrate, with an estate of 150-200 mostly wooded acres. He married Sarah hey had six children born between 1863 and 1880. Among their grandchildren was Tyrus Raymond Cobb (1886-1961). As a teenager Ty Cobb often spent summers with his grandparents who unlike his parents encouraged him to play baseball. n Cherokee County, North Carolina. Robert Lafayette Cooper House - Murphy, NC he Robert Lafayette Cooper House is a historic house located at 109 Campbell street. The two story wood frame house was built 1889-91, and is one of the finest Queen Anne Victorian houses in Cherokee County. The house was built by Robert

Lafayette Cooper, a successful local lawyer, as a wedding present for his wife.

Franklin Pierce Cover House - Andrews, NC he 2-1/2 story brick Queen Anne Victorian was built in 1900 and is a remnant of Andrews' industrial heritage. The house was built by Franklin Pierce Cover, owner of a local tannery. The handsome Queen Anne style brick structure is one of the largest historic residences remaining. A small frame tenant house or servant house, built on a saddlebag plan and dating from the period of the main house construction, survives on the property. A wash house originally associated with the main house is now on the adjacent property.

First Baptist Church - Andrews, NC

The former First Baptist Church, now referred to as the Valleytown Cultural Arts Center, is a historic Baptist church building at 101 Chestnut Street in Andrews. The Classical Revival brick structure was built in 1923 for a congregation founded in 1902; it was their second building on the site. It was used by the congregation until

Harshaw Chapel and Cemetery - Murphy, NC

Located at Church and Central Streets, Harshaw Chapel is a small vernacular Greek Revival brick church built during the 1860s for the first Methodist congregation in Murphy. The church building was donated by Joshua Harshaw, a prominent early settler in the county. The site of the church and surrounding cemetery had been donated by Harshaw in 1844, land he had purchased six years previously in the Indian land sales. The small church was replaced by the congregation in the 1920s, and its subsequent survival is remarkable in that it has received little use since. It is the oldest church building in Cherokee County, and is the oldest structure surviving relatively intact in Murphy. Harshaw Chapel is also the sole surviving example of mid-nineteenth century brick architecture in the county. The church is surrounded by a cemetery, containing the graves of many locally prominent citizens and a collection

Walker's Inn - Andrews, NC Built in 1840, the original log structure contained two rooms on the ground floor and two rooms above with a separate kitchen at the rear of the house. By 1864 the house had been expanded to its present state. Wrought iron door hinges, antique door latches, ceiling beams and bubble glass windows are a few of the unique and original features of this historic inn. The Walker Inn is an original stagecoach stop between

Asheville and Murphy located south of Andrews on SR 1505 off SR 1393 and NC 19.

Outdoor Recreation

Cherokee County is a center for outdoor recreation because of our location. Cherokee County is located within Nantahala National Forest with the Chattahoochee National Forest and Great Smoky Mountain National Park close by.

Our public lands offer more than 245 miles of bike trails. In addition, forest roads are also open for mountain biking, unless otherwise signed. The Ramsey Bluff Bike Trail System is located at the Hanging Dog Campground area, and offers under-utilized adventure in mountain biking, hiking, and cross-country running The eight mile labyrinth of trails is actually a group of connected loops, allowing an interesting variety of combinations for repeat visitors to explore. The trail difficulty ranges from easy to moderate, and range from 1500 to 1900' in elevation. The trail system has two good access points with parking: the Upper Parking area above the Boat Launch, and Iceberg Hill on Ramsey Bluff Road. Restrooms are near the Boat Launch trailhead.

Piney Knob Trail System, 22.3 miles of recreational hiking and mountain biking trails on the 700+ acre Murphy Watershed property is off of Piney Knob Hill Road. All trails are dirt single-track trails and built in accordance with International

Cherokee County offers a plethora of camping options. Whether its tenting under the stars or tucked away in a luxury RV with all the amenities, this is the perfect camping destination. Carriage Hills Farm Equine Camping, Murphy/ Peace Valley KOA, Persimmon Creek Campground, Valley River RV Resort, and WagonMaster Adventure Ranch provide quality camping options.

Many game animals, including white-tailed deer, black bear, wild turkey, ruffed grouse and gray squirrel, thrive in the forest. The Forest Service provides a variety of hunting opportunities, including accessible hunting in the following areas. Where there are fields adjacent to or a short distance from the road: Perry Gap Road: Deep Gap Road: Fires Creek Road: Nelson Ridge Road: Tuni Gap Road: Beech Creek Road: Panther Top Road: Powerline Cove Road: Copper Creek Road: and Davis Creek Road. Parking is available in wide areas along the roads.

Our public lands are a haven for fishing. Cold water, mountain streams are prime habitat for brown, rainbow and native brook trout. All national forest streams

are "wild trout waters," unless classified and posted otherwise. With several trout streams. Cherokee County has become a popular place for fly fishing. Trout fishing season lasts from April – February, which makes it a great activity for almost any time of the year. For the angler looking for spotted bass, striped bass, hybrids, walleye, crappie, catfish, bluegill, large or smallmouth bass Lake Hiwassee, Lake Cherokee, or Appalachia Lake offer those varieties. If you need gear, visit Shook's Marina, Duke's Hideaway or Mountain View Marina to rent a boat or utilize a guide service like Big of Fish Guide Service or Apalachia Lake

Whitewater Sports

With two world class rivers within a few miles of Cherokee County, rafting, canoeing or kayaking is a great family activity. The Ocoee River - just across the border in Tennessee with class III to IV rapids - played host to the 1996 Summer Olympics and boasts a number of professional rafting companies. For a slightly slower pace try the Nantahala River to the north of Cherokee County. This class II and III river is family friendly with self-guided rafts and kayaks available for rent. Of course the Nottely River, the Hiwassee River and Valley River along with many lesser tributaries are available for canoeing, boating or tubing. If you need equipment or prefer a guide, try using Carolina Outfitters, Rolling Thunder River Company Nantahala Outdoor Center or Carolina Ocoee.
